

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Margaret Anne Boone a minor, of Caroline county, was read the second time and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to provide for the sale of certain lands in Baltimore county late the property of John Ridgely, deceased, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to alter the times of the meeting of the court of appeals, and for other purposes, was read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Rachel Evans, of Anne Arundel county, was read the second time by special order and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. L. Hollingsworth, Resolved, that the communication from the executive of the 13th instant, be referred to a special committee. Ordered, that Messrs. L. Hollingsworth, Stephen and Johnson be a committee to consider and report thereon.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Murphy, of Montgomery county, and the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to open the navigation of Zachia Run, were severally read the second time and will pass with certain amendments.

The senate adjourns until to morrow morning nine o'clock.

FRIDAY, January 27.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday except Mr. Holbrook who is indisposed. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to open the navigation of Zachia Run, and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Murphy, of Montgomery county, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion the question was put, will the senate reconsider the bill entitled, an act authorising a sale of the real property of which Gabriel G. Van Horn died possessed? Resolved in the affirmative. The bill being read the question was put, shall the said bill pass. Determined in the negative. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to appoint Thomas Harris, junr. of the city of Annapolis, trustee for the sale of the real estate of John Gwinn, Esq. late of the said city deceased, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolutions relative to the pay to the governor as commander in chief of the militia of this state during the year 1813, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to repeal an act of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. L. Hollingsworth from the committee delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the resolutions of the legislature of the states of North Carolina and Pennsylvania, relative to a proposed amendment of the constitution of the United States, limiting the senatorial term of service to four years instead of six, report, that they have taken the same into consideration and are of opinion that it is inexpedient to concur with said amendment; therefore,

Resolved, That it is inexpedient to concur with the proposed amendment of the constitution of the United States, limiting the term of service of a senator of the United States to four years.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to transmit authenticated copies of the abovementioned resolution to the executives of the several states, with a request that they be laid before the legislatures thereof, and also one copy to each member of the senate and house of representatives representing this state in the congress of the United States.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of certain negroes therein mentioned, was read the second time, and will pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to annul the marriage of Charles R. Green and Ann Green his wife of the city of Baltimore, passed by that house the 26th January, 1815, and a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to fix and regulate the quality of silver plate manufactured and sold or offered for sale in the city of Baltimore and for other purposes, passed by that house the 27th January, 1815. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the improvement of the navigation of the river Susquehanna, endorsed, will not pass. Also returns a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to direct descents, endorsed, will pass with the proposed amendments. Which amendments were severally read, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed. Also returns the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts, with the following message:
