On motion by Mr. Brown, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to repeal part of the act of assembly entitled, an act relating to vagrants in the city of Baltimore. Ordered, that Messrs. Brown, Johnson and Nabbs, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. N. Williams, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session. Ordered that Messrs. N. Williams, Brown and Worthington, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. N. Williams from the committee, delivers the said bill, which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act relating to the judges of the several courts of this state, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the lotteries therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The president of the senate lays before them a letter from Ninian Pinkney, clerk of the council, praying an increase of salary. Which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for opening and extending Aisquith street in the Eastern precincts of Baltimore. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Also returns the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the settlement of claims arising from the past or future employment of the militia of this state, passed by that house 28th January 1815. Ordered to be engrossed.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning nine o'clock.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to open and extend Queen street in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to appoint commissioners to grade, level, pave & repair the streets, squares, lanes & alleys, in that part of the Eastern precincts of Baltimore, therein described, and for other purposes, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Alexander Hason, of Cecil county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the journal of accounts, assented to by that house the 27th of January 1815. Which was read and assented to. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

And a bill entitled, an act for the payment of the journal of accounts. Which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

And the following resolution :

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, January 27, 1815.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Tobias E. Sainsbury or order the sum of forty dollars, being the amount of a balance due him for his attendance as a member of the house of delegates at December session 1813, and omitted to be allowed him on the journal of accounts of that session.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road therein mentioned in Cecil county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The engrossed bills from No. 77 to 83 inclusive, were severally read, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Brown from the committee, delivers a bill entitled, an act to repeal part of the act of assembly entitled, an act relating to vagrants in the city of Baltimore. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to fix and regulate the quality of silver plate manufactured and sold or offered for sale in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the members of the Library company of Emmitsburg in Frederick county, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Resolved in the affirmative. The amendments being read, the 1st and 16th were receded from, and the 3d and 12th adhered to.
