*Resolved*, That hereafter no clerk, or other officers of the Legislature of this state, shall be allowed any additional salary or extra compensation, for any service he or they may render in his or their several stations.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Mary Johnson, of Charles county, was read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The engrossed bills No. 109 to 112 inclusive, were severally read and assented to.

The bill entitled, an act vesting in the orphans courts in the several counties of this state, certain powers relative to real property, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to repeal part of the act of assembly entitled, an act relating to vagrants in the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and will not pass.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the aid of the Library company of Baltimore. The bill entitled, an act authorising Alexander Johnson, late sheriff and collector of Charles county, to complete his collection. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Robert Teeling, of Worcester county. A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to open a road in Queen Ann's county. A bill entitled, an act to make valid a power of attorney from Toussant F. V. Caharel, to David and William Winchester, severally passed by that house the 1st of February 1815.

Also returns the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to alter the times of the meeting of the court of appeals, and for other purposes. The bill entitled, an act to incorporate Elkton in Cecil county. The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Susquehanna turnpike company. And the bill entitled, an act for the extension of streets in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes, endorsed, "will not pass."

Also returns the bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the Levy courts of the several counties of this state, to lay out or cause to be laid out public roads in their respective counties, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments ;" which amendments were read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And the following resolutions :

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, February 1, 1815.

*Resolved*, That the governor and council be, and they are hereby authorised to establish from time to time, such rules and regulations for the recruiting service, for the troops authorised to be raised by an act entitled, an act to provide for the better defence of the state, and prevent the necessity of frequent calls of the militia as they shall judge proper, and that the bounty for every non-commissioned officer, musician or private who shall enlist in the said troops, shall be fifty dollars, to be paid at the time of enlistment.

*Resolved*, That for the bounties and other necessary expenses attending the raising of said troops, there shall be appropriated the sum of three hundred thousand dollars, to be paid by the treasurer of the Western Shore out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
