That it appears to your committee the said treasurer hath paid away from the first day of November, 1814, to the first day of November, 1815, the sum of 262,824 dollars and 26 cents; from all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts; and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 569,717 dollars and 83 cents, exchanged six per cent stock; 335,104 dollars and 74 cents funded three per cent stock of the United States; 4,919 dollars and 13 cents of the emissions of bills of credit made by an act of congress of the 18th of March, 1780, and the sum of 76,587 dollars and 19 cents specie, which sum of specie is appropriated in the manner following, to wit:

Mr Lloyd moved the following preamble and order :

Whereas, by the constitution and form of government Prince George's county is divided into five election districts; and whereas, it appears by the return of the judges of election in said county, that an election was held in four only of these districts; or if an election was held in the second district, that the votes taken in said district have been withheld or suppressed: And whereas, it is impossible for this house to exercise its constitutional authority in judging of the elections of its members, if a part of the votes given in any county may be suppressed or withheld at the pleasure of the persons appointed to preside over its elections—Therefore,

Ordered, That the report of the committee of elections, so far as it relates to Prince George's county, be recommitted to said committee, with instructions to enquire from the judges signing the return from Prince Georges county, whether any election was held in district No. 2, of said county, on the first Monday of October last, for delegates to the General Assembly; and if any election was held in said district, to enquire strictly into the causes and manner of the suppression of the votes taken therein, and by what authority, and report to this house. Which was read.

On the second reading of the said preamble and order, on motion by Mr. Lloyd, the question was put, that the house adopt so much of the preamble as is contained between the beginning and the word "suppressed," being the end of the first clause thereof, to which the following amendment was proposed on motion by Mr. E. K. Wilson—Strike out the words "been withheld or suppressed," and insert the words "not been returned" Which was agreed to.

On motion, the question was then put, that the house adopt the preamble so amended? Resolved unani-
