

The bill for the benefit of the heirs of John Hesselius, late of Alleghany county deceased. The bill to appoint trustees for the sale of the property therein mentioned, being part of the real estate of the late Henry Willis, deceased. The bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of completing St. Lucas reformed church in Frederick county. The bill for the benefit of Ebenezer Truitt of Worcester county. The bill annulling the marriage of Thomas Drake, and Martha his wife of Kent county. The bill for the relief of John Adams of Washington county. The bill to authorise Walter Slicer of Alleghany county, to import and bring into this state a certain negro therein named; and the bill authorising the Levy court of Washington county, to Levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, were sent to the senate.

Mr. M Mahow delivers a bill entitled, an act for introducing a copious supply of Water into the town of Cumberland. Which was read.

The report in favor of John D. Jaquet, was read the second time and the resolution therein contained assented to.

The bill entitled, an act to make public a road in Baltimore county. was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Stevens delivers a bill entitled, an act for draining part of a branch known by the name of Anderson branch, lying in Queen Ann's county. Which was read.

Mr. Lecompte delivers a petition from Morris Roach of Dorchester county, praying that a certain deed executed to him may be recorded. Which was read referred to Messrs. Lecompt, Criffith and Hart.

Also a petition from sundry inhabitants of said county, praying for a road from Vienna to the cross roads. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lecompte, Pitt and Dennis.

Mr. Van Horn delivers a bill entitled, an act annulling the marriage of Thomas W. Hooper and Frances A. Hooper. Which was read.

The bill entitled, an act repealing the fourth section of an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make an artificial road therein mentioned; and the bill entitled, an act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, were severally read the second time and passed.

Mr. Forwood delivers a bill entitled, an act to authorise the people to elect the judges of election Which was read.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the river Susquehanna, through Charles town to the Elkton and Christiana turnpike road, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read the first and second time by special order, agreed to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also a bill entitled, an act to authorise the president of the United States to erect toll gates on the Western road, laid out and made by the United States, leading from Cumberland across the mountains towards the river Ohio, and for other purposes, passed by the senate December 21, 1815. Which was read. And on motion by Mr. Bowles, Ordered, that the said bill be referred to the committee appointed on that part of the communication from the executive relative to the passage of a law authorising the erection of toll gates on the Western road leading across the mountains.

The house adjourns until Wednesday next.

The house met. The speaker being absent, Ephraim K. Wilson, Esquire, was called to the chair. The proceedings of Friday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday were read.

The bill entitled, an act repealing the fourth section of an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make an artificial road therein mentioned. And the bill entitled, an act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, and the resolution in favor of John D. Jaquet, were sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Little, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the Levy court of Baltimore county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned. Ordered, that Messrs. Little, Harryman and William Stuart, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Kilgour, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a straight turnpike road from the city of Washington to Baltimore. Ordered, that Messrs. Kilgour, Thomas, Duvall, Bowles and Edward G. Williams, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Howard delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Frederick county, praying for a turnpike road beginning at or near Westminster in Frederick county, to the west end of Liberty town in said county. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Howard, Thomas and Taney.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from Samuel Price of Baltimore county, praying that the register of the Land office may be authorised to correct a mistake in the surveyor's certificate returned into his office, relative to a tract of land called Price's enlargement. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Harryman Little and Lecompte.
