THURSDAY, January 18.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of the Consolidated bank of Maryland, was sent to the senate.

Richard Graham, Esquire, a delegate returned from Calvert county, appeared, qualified and took his seat.

The bill from the senate entitled, an act to lay out a road from Singleton Burgee's mill on Bennet's creek to a new cut road leading from Massencope's smiths shop to New Market, in Frederick county, was read the second time and the question put, shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative, and the bill returned to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Lecompte the following message was read, agreed to and sent to the senate.:

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Jeremiah Rymer, alias Jeremiah Bean. The bill entitled, a supplement to an act respecting a monument or statue to the memory of Washington. The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the Baltimore and Frederick turnpike, at or near the fifty fifth mile stone west of Middle town to the Potomac river near M'Shan's ferry; and the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from or near Baltimore city in Baltimore county, through Liberty town in Frederick county to Hager's town in Washington county, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed; and the bill entitled, an act to authorise the drawing of a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a bridge over Britain's bay, in Saint Mary's county, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
