The speaker with a number of members attended, but a quorum not being present, adjourned until to morrow morning 9 o'clock.

SATURDAY, January 27.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as relate to the division of Alleghany county, into election districts, were read the second time and dissented from.

On motion by Mr. Bowles, the following resolution was read the first and second time by special order, assented to and sent to the senate.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay unto Jonathan Tutwiller or order in quarterly payments a sum equal to the half pay of a serjeant instead of that of a private.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the Frederick and Baltimore turnpike road commencing at the west end of Frederick town to Harper's ferry on the Potomac river, were read the second time, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, an act authorising the sale of the real and personal estate therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from the commissioners of the Eastern precincts of Baltimore praying that they may be authorised to open and extend Low street and for other purposes. Which was read and referred to Messrs. Harryman, W. Stuart, Randall, Little and Stansbury.

The amendment proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act declaring the continuation and extension of the charters of the several banks therein mentioned, was read the second time, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill entitled, an act to secure the printing of the laws and votes and proceedings and to require the faithful performance thereof by the printer to the state, endorsed, passed by the senate January 27, 1816. Which was read. Also the bill entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of the Consolidated Bank of Maryland, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment." Which amendment was read.

On motion by Mr. Hilleary, the following resolution was read the first and second time by special order, assented to and sent to the senate.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, January 27, 1816.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Rezin Simpson or his order, annually in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a serjeant of dragoons in lieu of the sum allowed him by a resolution of eighteen hundred and eleven.
