Ordered to be engrossed. The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish pilots and regulate their fees, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments. Which amendments were read assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed. The bill entitled, an act granting a loan of money to the levy court of Calvert county; and the bill for the relief of William G. M'Cluer of the city of Baltimore, severally endorsed, "will not pass."

The report of the committee relative to the safe keeping of arms, camp equipage, &c. now distributed among the militia of this state, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. E. K. Wilson, the bank therein was filled up with five hundred dollars. The question was then put that the house concur with the report and assent to the resolution therein contained? Resolved in the affirmative and the resolution sent to the senate.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the report of the committee relative to the deficiency of state funds. On motion by Mr. Little, the question was put that the words "and the act of November session 1808 for the purchase of arms and accoutrements" in the resolution be stricken out? Determined in the negative.

The report being read throughout the question was put, that the house concur therewith and assent to the resolution therein contained? Resolved in the affirmative and the resolution sent to the senate. The report on the memorial of the inspectors of the penitentiary of Maryland, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Van Horn, the question was put, that the said report be referred to the consideration of the next General Assembly? Resolved in the affirmative.

The report on the petition of the keeper and deputy keepers of the penitentiary of Maryland, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. E. K. Wilson, the same was referred to the next General Assembly.

The amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make several turnpike roads therein mentioned, were read the second time, the first dissented from and the second assented to.

On motion by Mr. A. D. Mitchell, the following message was read, agreed to and sent to the senate together with the bill therein referred to
