Mr. Davis, (Pres't) and Frazier appeared in the senate.

The proceedings from Friday the 22d instant, inclusive, were read.

The bill entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Harford county; and the bill entitled, an act supplementary to the act entitled, an act to alter, straighten and amend the road therein mentioned, in Harford county, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for erecting a bridge over the river Potomac near Williamsport in Washington county, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of completing Saint Lucas Reformed church in Frederick county; and the bill entitled, an act to authorise Walter Slicer of Alleghany county to import and bring into this state a certain negro the ein named, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county, was read the second time passed with an amendment and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties. A bill entitled, an act repealing the fourth section of an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make an artificial road therein mentioned, severally passed by that house December 22, 1815; and a resolution in favor of John D. Jaquet, a revolutionary soldier. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act authorising the drawing of a lottery for the benefit of the surgical institution of Baltimore. The bill entitled, an act authorising the Levy court of Washington county to levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned; and the bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Adams of Washington county, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 9 o'clock:

MONDAY, January 1, 1816.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Messrs. Brown, L. Hollingsworth, Johnson, Kent and N. Williams, appeared in the senate.

On motion of Mr. N. Williams, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts. Ordered, that Messrs. N. Williams, Hebb and Brown, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. N. Williams from the committee delivers said bill. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. L. Hollingsworth, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act relating to the bank in this state. Ordered, that Messrs. L. Hollingsworth, N. Williams and Kent, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. N. Williams presented a memorial from William M'Donald, and others, counter to the petition for improving M'Clure's dock, in the city of Baltimore. Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Baltimore county, was read the second time, passed with an amendment and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. N. Williams; Resolved, that the further consideration of the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Baltimore county, be indefinitely postponed.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the Levy courts of the several counties of this state to lay out public roads in their respective counties, was read the second time and the question put shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:
