The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Sarah Clarkson, of Kent county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the president and managers of the Calverton turnpike road, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel McClellan, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. W. Hollingsworth, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Elkton Bank of Maryland. Ordered, that Messrs. W. Hollingsworth, Hebb and Brown be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Centreville Bank of Maryland, passed by that house January 10, 1816. A bill entitled, an act to lay out and make public a road in Cecil county. A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act to provide for the settlement of claims arising from the past or future employment of the militia of this state. A bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the village of Liberty town to intersect the Baltimore and Reister's town turnpike road at or near the west end of the town of Westminster. A bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of the Western precincts of the city of Baltimore, to make a survey and plot of said precincts and for other purposes. A bill entitled, an act to authorise the making of sewers in the Western precincts of Baltimore; and a bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed from William K. Clagett, of Baltimore county, to Samuel A. Berry, of Charles county, severally passed by that house January 11, 1816. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act to authorise Philemon Towson and Sebastian Graff to sell and dispose of certain property in the city of Baltimore, belonging to them and their infant children, passed by that house January 11, 1816. Ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. W. Hollingsworth from the committee delivers a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Elkton Bank of Maryland. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act to repeal the fourth section of an act entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, was read the second time and will not pass.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

FRIDAY, January 12.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday except Mr. L. Hollingsworth. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion, the question was put, will the senate re-consider the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of the widow and infant children of Thomas Gibson, late of Frederick county, deceased? Resolved in the affirmative.
