FRIDAY, January 19.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Messrs Johnson and N. Williams, appeared in the senate.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road therein mentioned. The bill entitled, an act for draining a branch of Tuckahoe known by the name of Beaver dam Branch, in Queen Ann's county. The bill entitled, an act to make valid the deed therein mentioned. The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Nicholas Boswell, of Montgomery county; and the resolution in favor of John Witt, of Alleghany county, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the Frederick and Baltimore turnpike road commencing at the west end of Frederick town to Harper's ferry on the Potomac river, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr Johnson, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road to lead from the cross roads near Rich and Calon's limekiln, in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones's falls to the city of Baltimore. Ordered, that Messrs. Johnson, L. Hollingsworth and N Williams, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Johnson from the committee delivers the said bill. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. N. Williams, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to direct descents. Ordered, that Messrs. N. Williams, Hebb and Kent, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. N Williams from the committee delivers the said bill. Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of the state as relate to the division of Alleghany county into election districts, was read the second time, passed with sundry amendments and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel Lukins of Montgomery county. A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland; and for the extension of the charters of the several banks of this state, and for other purposes. A bill entitled, an act authorising the Levy court of Prince George's county, to levy annually on said county money for the support of sundry persons as out pensioners. A bill entitled, an act to authorise the drawing of a lottery for the benefit of the West Nottingham Academy, in Cecil county, severally passed by that house January 18, 1816. A bill entitled, an act to revive and amend an act entitled, an act for establishing a company for opening and extending the navigation of the river Pocomoke. A bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate certain persons in every christian church or congregation in this state. A bill entitled, an act relating to the rector and trustees of the Roman Catholic church of Saint Peter, in the city of Baltimore, severally passed by that house January 19, 1816; and a resolution relative to the employment or harboring of run-away negroes by the citizens of Pennsylvania. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Henry Hicks, of Anne Arundel county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise Christopher Jonson, of the city of Baltimore, to lease and let out the leasehold estate and property which belonged to Daniel Deady, deceased, was read the second time, passed with an amendment and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the collectors of the county taxes of the several counties of this state, to execute deeds of conveyance in the cases therein mentioned, was read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to encrease the capital stock in the Hager's town bank, was read the second time and will not pass.

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of Eli Gibbons, late of Somerset county, deceased, was read the second time and passed with an amendment.

The bill entitled an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of the bank of Dorchester; and the bill entitled, an act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Centreville bank of Maryland, were severally read the second time and will not pass.

On motion of Mr. L. Hollingsworth, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act relative to the inspection of tobacco in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes. Ordered, that Messrs. L. Hollingsworth, Fenwick and N. Williams be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.
