

The bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Cumberland, in Alleghany county, was read the second time by special order, and passed with sundry amendments.

### TUESDAY, January 23.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery for raising a sum of money to buy a lot of ground in Frederick town in Frederick county, and build a church and parsonage house thereon. The bill entitled, an act relating to the rector and trustees of the Roman Catholic church of Saint Peter, in the city of Baltimore. The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of Joseph Woodall, of Kent county, deceased. The bill entitled, an act to authorise the drawing of a lottery for the benefit of the West Nottingham Academy, in Cecil county. The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Hager's town fire company in Washington county. The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from or near Baltimore city, in Baltimore county, through Liberty town in Frederick county, to Hager's town in Washington county. The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the heirs of John Richardson, late of Caroline county, deceased. The bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of the Western precincts of the city of Baltimore, to make a survey and plot of said precincts, and for other purposes. The bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned. The bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes. The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise and empower the Levy court of Charles county, to assess, and levy a sum of money on the assessable property thereof, for the purpose of building a jail in said county. The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna near Rock run. The bill entitled, an act to authorise the president and directors of the Choptank bridge company to contract with the Levy court of Caroline county for the passage of the citizens of said county over said bridge, and for other purposes therein mentioned. The bill entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Cumberland in Alleghany county. The bill entitled, an act relating to streets in the city and precincts of Baltimore. The resolution authorising the governor and council to employ additional counsel to defend the suit commenced against the state by Jehu Chandler, and the resolution relative to printing the laws and votes and proceedings, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise Zephaniah Waters, of Charles county, to raise by lottery a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time by special order passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act authorising the sale of certain property therein mentioned; and the bill entitled, an act to authorise the Levy court of Harford county, to levy money for building a bridge, were severally read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act supplementary to the act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre de Grace, was read the second time by special order, passed with sundry amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising Henry S. Yates, of Charles county, to bring sundry negroes into this state, passed by that house January 15, 1816. A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna. A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to sheriffs and for other purposes. A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Anne Higgins, of Anne Arundel county. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Shadrack Tipton; and a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the filling up and extending of certain lots on the south side of the basin in the city of Baltimore, severally passed by that house January 22, 1816. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Also delivers the engrossed bills from No. 1 to 80 inclusive, severally assented to by that house January 23, 1816. Which were severally read and assented to.

Also returns the bill entitled, an act for the relief of the Baltimore company, passed by that house January 23, 1816. Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to erect a town in Queen Anne's county, was read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The report of the committee on the resolutions in favor of the officers and privates in the revolutionary war, was read the second time and concurred in. The resolutions therein mentioned were then severally read the second time, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favor of John Sprigg Belt, and John Boone, were severally read the second time, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolutions in favor of Jonathan Tutwiller, Rezin Simpson, Joseph S. Smith, and Mountjoy Bayly, were severally read the second time, dissented from, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
