The bill being read the question was put, shall this bill pass? Determined in the negative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna, was read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Patapsco manufacturing company, was read the second time by special order, and passed with an amendment.

The bill entitled, an act authorising Henry S. Yates, of Charles county, to bring sundry negroes into this state, was read the second time by special order, and passed with sundry amendments.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel Lukins, of Montgomery county, was read the second time and will not pass.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to direct descents, was read the second time and will pass.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning nine o'clock.
