

Cecil county. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of William G. M'Cluer, of the city of Baltimore. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Davis, of Talbot county. A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Union Insurance company of Maryland. A bill entitled, an act authorising Joseph Darden, late collector of Talbot county, to complete his collection. A bill entitled, an act granting a loan of money to the Levy court of Calvert county. A bill entitled, an act to make a public road from the Etna Powder Works in Baltimore county. A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Elizabeth Barrow the widow and the devisee of William Barrow, late of Dorchester county, deceased, severally passed by that house January 25, 1816. Resolutions in favor of Abraham Hooper and Michael M'Cann, revolutionary soldiers; a resolution in favor of lieutenant colonel Thomas Wright; and a resolution in favor of John Sullivan. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also delivers the engrossed bills from No. 81 to 91 and from No. 96 to 120 all inclusive, severally assented to by that house January 26, 1816. Which were severally read, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk. Also returns the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from or near Baltimore city in Baltimore county, through Liberty town in Frederick county to Hager's town in Washington county. The bill entitled, an act to enable Robert Lloyd Tilghman, Tench Tilghman and William H. Tilghman, the executors of James Earle, late of Talbot county, deceased, to sell and dispose of the real estate of his infant children. The bill entitled, an act to authorise the collectors of the county taxes of the several counties of this state to execute deeds of conveyance in the cases therein mentioned; and the bill entitled, an act to authorise the sheriffs and collectors of the several counties of this state to complete their collections, severally passed by that house January 25, 1816. Ordered to be engrossed. Also returns the bill entitled, an act to authorise the president of the United States to erect toll gates on the Western road, (laid out and made by the United States,) leading from Cumberland across the mountains towards the river Ohio and for other purposes, endorsed, by the house of delegates, January 25, 1816; read the second time and will not pass.

The bill entitled, an act extending the benefit of the insolvent laws to certain petitioners therein mentioned, was read the second time by special order, amended, and the question put shall this bill pass with the proposed amendments? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Middleton B. Magruder, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time by special order and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Levin Jones, of Baltimore city, was read the second time and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of the county courts, was read the second time and the question put, shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

The resolution in favor of James Wilkinson, was read the second time by special order, assented to and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a straight turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to the Buck tavern, was read the second time, and the question put, shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

So it was determined in the negative.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the justices of the Levy court of Caroline county to discontinue the road therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make the several turnpike roads therein mentioned, was read the second time by special order, passed with sundry amendments and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Baltimore county court to record a deed from Peter Gerard to Daniel Buff, was read the second time by special order and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Exchange Company, was read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for certain purposes therein mentioned. A bill entitled, an act to lay out and straighten a road in Baltimore county. A bill entitled, an act to confirm and make valid the proceedings of the orphan's court of Frederick county. A bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to direct deponents. A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the president and directors of the Exchange Company. A bill entitled, an act for the relief of William S. Gaither, of Alleghany county. A bill entitled, an act to condemn a lot in the city of Baltimore for a street, severally passed by that house January 26, 1816; and a resolution relative to the government house. Which were severally read the second time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act respecting the register of wills in Saint Mary's county, with the following message:
