The bill entitled, an act authorising Joseph Darden, late collector of Talbot county, to complete his collection, was read the second time by special order and will not pass; sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Lewis Michael, of Frederick county. A bill entitled, an act to alter and change the name of Lewis Pinney, of the city of Baltimore, into the name of Lewis Lea. A bill entitled, an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a lot of ground in the city or precincts of Baltimore and to erect a building thereon to be used as an engine house. A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to empower Burgess Willett, executor of Robert W. Fleming, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, to collect fees and county taxes put into his hands for collection in his life, severally passed by that house January 27, 1816. A resolution in favor of Caleb Stewart and Henry Thompson; a resolution in favor of the examiner general; and a resolution in favor of Rezin Simpson, a revolutionary soldier. Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. Also returns the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Sarah Clarkson, of Kent county, passed by that house January 27, 1816. Ordered to be engrossed. Also returns the bill entitled, an act relating to streets in the city and precincts of Baltimore; and the bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road to lead from the cross roads near Richard Caton's lime kiln in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones' falls to the city of Baltimore, severally endorsed, will not pass.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to admit persons conscientiously scrupulous of taking an oath to serve as jurors, was read the second time, passed with an amendment and sent to house of delegates by the clerk.

Resolved, That the person to be chosen shall be a resident of the Western Shore of the state of Maryland, and that the person having a majority of all the attending members of both houses of the General Assembly, be declared duly elected to represent this state in the senate of the United States, and that a commission issue to the said senator appointed as aforesaid, signed by the governor for the time being, or in his absence by the presiding member of the council in the following words, to wit:

The state of Maryland to
 Greeting The General Assembly of Maryland reposing especial confidence in your integrity and abilities, have appointed you senator to represent this state in the senate of the United States from the present time to the third day of March, eighteen hundred and twenty one. Given under my hand and the seal of this state this _____ day of _____ eighteen hundred and sixteen.
