Mr. N. Williams from the committeee delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred so much of the message from the governer and council of the Sth of December last, as relates to the printing of the bill for the amendment of our militia system, have had the same under consideration and beg leave to report: That as the senate did not at the last session assent to any order or resolution for printing the bill introduced into the house of delegates for the amendment of our militia system, the governor and council are in an error when they state it was published according to the direction of the general assembly. The senate could not consistently with their opinion of the provisions of that bill have thought it of any advantage to the people that it should he published.
