The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the drawing of a lottery or lotteries in the city of Baltimore, to build a Masonic Hall for Washington lodge number 3, in that part of said city known and distinguished by the name of Fells Point; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the devisees of James Calhoun; the bill, entitled, An act relating to writs of certiorari in the cases therein mentioned: the bill, entitled, An act to change the mode of repairing the public roads in Worcester county; the resolution in favour of William H. Marriott; the bill, entitled, An act authorising and requiring the governor and council to contract with the registers of the land office on each shore, for making out such indexes as are therein prescribed; the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Noble of Somerset county; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Isaac Tier of Worcester county; the bill, entitled, An act for the sale of the real estate of William G. Cochran, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased; the bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for building a bridge over the river Susquehanna; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for building a masonic hall in Elkton, Cecil county; were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana bridge, was read the second time and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the chancellor to issue warrants for survey as therein mentioned; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Eli Tarr of Worcester county; the bill, entitled, An act for the encouragement of internal improvement; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Mary Comegys and others; the bill, entitled, An act authorising Joseph Darden, late collector of Talbot county, to complete his collections; were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Frederick-Town Bank, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Taney, leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Potomac company. Ordered, that Messrs. Taney, Emerson and Leigh, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same; who reported the said bill; which on motion, was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to lease to Joseph I. Hopkins and Gerard R. Cowman part of a lot or parcel of land therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed; In the 9th line of the 1st section strike out the word "will" and insert "shall". The bill, entitled, An act authorising the sale or leasing of the poor house and ground belonging therein to in Baltimore county, and to provide for building a new one, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the word "house" in the title of the bill and insert "house of delegates". 2. After the word "out" in the 4th line of the 1st section insert "and." 3. After the word "house" in the 6th line of the 2d section insert "and a separate place for the reception of vagrants."

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, was read the second time, will pass with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the appointing inspectors and wood corders, and to regulate the cording of firewood brought by water to the city of Baltimore for sale; the bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy the sums of money for the persons therein mentioned, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Winchester reported a bill, entitled, An act relating to insolvent debtors in the city and county of Baltimore; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make public the roads therein mentioned in Harford county and for other purposes, was read, and on re-consideration passed, and sent with a message to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising Marsham Parker, late sheriff of Calvert county, to complete the collection; the bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to direct descent; the bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of The Bank of Dorchester; the bill, entitled, An act relating to the streets in the city of Baltimore; the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of the Shrewsbury Academy in Kent county; the bill, entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year eighteen hundred and seventeen; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Havre-de-Grace Bank, passed and sent to the house of delegates with sundry amendments, and returned by that house, passed with further amendments; which were assented to, and ordered to be engrossed.
