RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Samuel Scott, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, the half pay of a private during his life, for those services he rendered his country during the revolutionary war.

The resolutions in favour of J. Joseph Henry ; in favour of Elisha Brown, were severally read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

The resolution relative to runaway negroes ; the resolution relative to Kilty's compilation of British statutes ; the resolution relative to the new edition of the laws of the United States ; also the resolution relative to the collection of the public arms, were severally read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising Samuel G. Griffith of the city of Baltimore, to remove and bring to this state a certain negro therein mentioned ; the bill, entitled, An act to exempt the inhabitants in and near Manchester in Baltimore county from tollage when they are going to or coming from public worship, were severally read the second time by special order and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to direct descents ; the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Robert Oldson of Queen-Ann's county ; were severally read the second time and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, An act to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills : The bill, entitled, An act for laying out and opening a road in Harford county ; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery or lotteries for the purpose of purchasing a public library and establishing and endowing a free school in Prince-George's county ; severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act for the sale of the real estate of William G. Cochran, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased ; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the infant children of Benjamin Clave of Alvert county ; the bill, entitled, An act to enable Milcah Owings, guardian of Caleb Daughady, Eleanor Daughady, John Stewart, Susan Stewart, and Margaret Stewart, to sell and convey part of a lot of ground in the city Baltimore, severally passed and ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to confirm and make valid a deed from Ralph Randolph Wormley, as attorney of Edmund Jennings of London, to Richard Norris ; the bill, entitled, An act to empower and authorise the several county courts of this state to direct the opening, straightening or shutting up, of public roads, were severally passed and ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to open the navigation of Zachia run, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the chancellor to issue warrants of survey as therein mentioned ; the bill, entitled, An act making valid receipts and acquittances executed by females above the age of sixteen years ; and the bill, entitled, An act relating to British property, and quieting possessions, were severally read the second time and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, An act to change the mode of collecting militia fines in the 3d brigade of Maryland militia, endorsed, " will not pass."

The bill, entitled, An act to invest the levy court of Baltimore county with the powers now exercised by the commissioners of the city and county of Baltimore, and for other purposes ; the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Achsah Risingson of Baltimore county, were severally read the second time and will pass. Sent to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year eighteen hundred and seventeen, read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates, and returned by that house with amendments ; which were read and assented to, and the bill passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Dorchester county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
