

## VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Cole, sheriff of Saint Mary's county, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to make a public road in Charles county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named; the bill, entitled, An act to inspect and transcribe the records of the surveyor of Charles county, and for other purposes, were severally read the second time.

The following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk:

BY THE SENATE, January 31, 1818.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,*

The senate have rejected the bill originated in your house, entitled, An act for the benefit of Jesse Hughes of Somerset county, and have passed another bill to accomplish the object, in a form which we hope will be found less exceptionable, and now send the same for your concurrence.

The resolution relative to compiling the laws, was read, adopted, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act concerning the judgments and judicial proceedings of the courts of justice in this state, and to provide for the completion of the records in certain cases, was read the second, and by special order, the third time and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to inspect and transcribe the records of the surveyor of Charles county, and for other purposes, was read the third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the title of The Planters Bank of Prince-George's county; was read the second and the third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to the militia of Allegany county, was read the second, and by special order, the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act relative to the state directors in the several banks in this state, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to enlarge the bounds of Baltimore county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: the bill, entitled, An act to provide for the erection of a bridge over Patapsco Falls at Ellicott's old upper mills, which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And returns the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth R. Snyder of the city of Baltimore, endorsed by that house, "January 31, 1818, read the first and second time by special order and will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre-de-Grace, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the preservation of buoys in the Patapsco river and Chesapeake bay, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of trustees of the poor house of Baltimore county, was read the second and third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Elkton to Christiana bridge, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Hibernian Society of Baltimore, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Carmichael from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act to prevent the several counties in this state from being operated with the charge of superannuated slaves; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

### MONDAY, February 2, 1818.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Mr. Winder. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. Taney appeared in the senate.

The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish Pilots and regulate their fees, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. Gale, Leave, given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relating to British property. Ordered, That Messrs. Gale, Hollyday and Carmichael, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make certain turnpike roads through the counties of Montgomery, Frederick and Washington, and for other purposes, was read the third time, and the question being put, Will this bill pass with the proposed amendments? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follows:
