

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of the Bladensburg Academy, and for other purposes, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Emerson from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the trustees from Calvert county for Charlotte Hall School to secede from the management thereof, and for other purposes; which was read the first, second, and third time, by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Theophilus Russell of Kent county, and Anne his wife; a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of lumber; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And returns the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Jesse Hughes of Somerset county, endorsed, "February 3, 1818; read the second time by special order and will pass" Also the bill, entitled, An act to prevent the unlawful exportation of negroes and mulattoes, and to alter and amend the laws concerning runaways, endorsed by that house, "January 31, 1818; read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments;" which were read, and the amendments assented to. Severally ordered to be engrossed. And a resolution in favour of Nathaniel Downing; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Joseph Ennalls of Dorchester county, was read the third time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to lay out and make public the roads therein mentioned in Harford county, and for other purposes, passed December session 1816, chapter 208, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the improvement of Princess Anne, in Somerset county, was read the third time and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of James Etcherson, and others, of Prince George's county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the German Society of Maryland, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Calvert from the committee reported a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, passed at November session 1810; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Gale reported a bill, entitled, An act relating to British property liable to confiscation; which was read the first, second, and third time, by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in Worcester county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Gale presented the petition of sundry inhabitants of Bridge-Town; which was read and referred to Messrs. Gale, Maxcy and Hollyday, to consider and report thereon

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, passed, at November session 1810, was read the second and third time, and the question put, Shall this bill pass? The bill, entitled, An act to authorise Arthur Craddock to bring a certain negro slave into this state, was read the third time, and on motion postponed for further consideration.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of Lumber, was read the second time and referred to Messrs. Gale, Hollyday and Jackson, to consider and report thereon

The bill, entitled, An act to establish an academy at Liberty-Town in Frederick county, was read the second and third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Frederick county to increase the pay of the overseer of the poor in said county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the improvement of the navigation of Corsica creek in Queen Anne's county. Ordered, That Messrs. Carmichael, Jackson and Emerson, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act to make valid a deed from William Mure, formerly of St. Mary's county, to John Maddox of St. Mary's county; a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower Charles Robinson and Elizabeth Robinson, administrators of Thomas Robinson, of Anne-Arundel county, deceased, to convey certain lands therein mentioned; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And returns the bill, entitled, An act for the extension of South-street in the city of Baltimore, endorsed by that house, "February 3, 1818; read the first and second time by special order, and will pass;" and the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Bank of Dorchester, endorsed by that house. "February 3, 1818; read the first and second time by special order and will pass." Severally ordered to be engrossed. And the bill, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of salted fish, endorsed by that house, "February 3, 1818; read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments;" which were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments, was read the second time.

The resolution relative to the settlement of the claims of this state against the general government, and the resolution respecting a monument to the memory of General Baron de Kalb, were received from the house of delegates, endorsed "assented to." Also a resolution for printing petitions, reports, &c. Ordered to be engrossed.
