

TUESDAY, February 10, 1817.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings from Saturday inclusive were read. Mr. Calvert and Mr. Maxcy appeared in the senate.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of John Read Magruder, clerk of Prince George's county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising Marsham Parker, late sheriff, and Aquilla G. Bowen late collector of Calvert county, to complete their collections, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The committee appointed on the part of the senate to confer with the committee appointed by the house of delegates, in relation to the bill, entitled, An act to regulate lotteries, beg leave to report, that they have fulfilled the duty confided to them, and the committee of conference have agreed to recommend that the said bill should be passed by the senate without amendment.

Which was read.

The bill, entitled, An act to regulate lotteries, was read the third time, and the question being put, Shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

AFFIRMATIVE.

So it was determined in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: a bill, entitled, An act to establish a bank or loan office to be called The Loan Office of Maryland; a bill, entitled, An act to allow mileage in certain cases to jurors in Washington county; a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons; a bill, entitled, An act to establish a comptroller of the treasury; a bill, entitled, An act to empower the mayor and city council of Baltimore to regulate and tax sales at auctions and for other purposes; a bill, entitled, An act to confirm the title to sundry lots of ground to the trustees of that part of the methodist church called "Sardis Chapel," in Talbot county; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And returns the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to prevent trespasses in Allegany county; and the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to alter, change and repeal, all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Washington county into election districts; severally endorsed "will not pass." Also, the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to alter and change such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Anne Arundel county into election districts, and to change the place of holding elections in the second election district of said county, endorsed, "will pass." The bill, entitled, An act to repeal the several acts of assembly for the destruction of crows in Somerset and Calvert counties, and the bill, entitled, An act relating to the city of Baltimore, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which were read and assented to. Ordered to be engrossed.

The following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the vestry of Trinity Parish, in Charles county, to raise by lottery a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the drawing of a lottery or lotteries for the purpose of erecting a bridge in Frederick county; the bill, entitled, An act authorising the drawing of a lottery for the benefit of Washington Lodge No. 59, of Free and Accepted Masons; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery for the benefit of the Maryland Foundling Hospital; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a lot of ground in the city of Baltimore and to erect a building thereon to be used as an engine house by the Washington Hose Company, and to incorporate said company; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of completing an invention in the art of war; the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the drawing of a lottery in the city of Baltimore; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the benefit and use of the German Lutheran and German Presbyterian congregation of Zion Church in Baltimore county; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to complete Trinity church, and to build a Parsonage House, within the city of Baltimore; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery for raising a sum of money to finish the Warren meeting house and walling in the yard of the same, in Baltimore county; the bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery of lotteries in Frederick county; the bill, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery to raise a sum of money for completing the Severn church in Anne Arundel county; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery of lotteries to raise a sum of money for building a Masonic Hall and Church in New Market in Frederick county; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery for raising a sum of money for repairing or rebuilding the Deer creek church, at the cross roads, in Harford county; the bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a Masonic Hall at Church Hill, in Queen Anne's county; and the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for founding an Academy in Hager's Town in Washington county; severally passed by the house of delegates, were severally read the third time and will not pass.

Mr. Hollyday from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of the meeting of the general assembly of this state, and for other purposes. Mr. Maxcy from the committee reported a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relates to the time and manner of electing the senate and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body, was read the second; and by special order the third time, and will not pass.
