

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth Hutton of Baltimore county; a bill, entitled, An act further to alter and amend the act, entitled, An act for the encouragement of such persons as will undertake to build water mills; also a resolution in favour of John Leads Kerr, and in favour of Evans Willing; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Liberty Fire Company in the city of Baltimore, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the establishment of an additional warehouse in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of tobacco, and the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate lotteries, severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth Hutton of Baltimore county, was on motion referred to Messrs. Jackson, Carmichael and Taney, to consider and report thereon.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Lawrence Oneal, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass.

Mr. Hollyday from the committee appointed on the bill, entitled, An act to confirm the title to sundry lots of ground to the trustees of that part of the Methodist Episcopal Church called Sardis Chapel, in Talbot county, reported the same without amendment; which was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk

The bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making the river Susquehanna navigable from the line of this state to tide water, was ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to regulate the manner of obtaining and altering public roads in this state, endorsed by the house of delegates "will not pass."

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Havre-de Grace Ferry Company; the bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna near Rock Run; and the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the building a bridge over the river Patapasco at the place called Hammonds ferry, were ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to appoint a warden for the jail of Baltimore county, returned by the house of delegates, endorsed, will not pass.

Which were severally read.

The bill, entitled, An act to impose a tax on all banks or branches thereof in the state of Maryland, not chartered by the legislature, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and the question being put, Shall this bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follows:

AFFIRMATIVE.

Mr. President, Messrs. Calvert, Emerson, Jackson, Magruder,—5.

NEGATIVE.

Messrs. Carmichael, Hollyday, Maxcy, Taney—4.

So it was determined in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to establish a comptroller of the treasury, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Carmichael from the committee to whom was referred the resolution in favour of the inspectors of the penitentiary, reported the same without amendment; and the question being put. Will the senate assent to the resolution? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

AFFIRMATIVE

NEGATIVE.

Mr. President, Messrs. Calvert, Emerson,—3.

So it was determined in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Taney, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to be called The Washington and Baltimore Canal Company. Ordered, That Messrs. Taney, Maxcy and Emerson, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Taney reported said bill, which was read the first, second and third time, by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of Evans Willing, was read the first second and third time by special order assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act relative to the village of Church-Hill in Queen Anne's county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the establishment of an additional warehouse in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of tobacco, was read the second and third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Isaac Parker of the city of Annapolis, was read the second and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to empower and authorise the several courts of this state to direct the opening and shutting up of public roads, was read the first, second and third time, by special order, and will not pass.
