The term for which the honourable Robert H. Goldsborough, one of the senators of the United States from the state of Maryland, was elected, will expire on the 4th of March next. We propose, with the concurrence of your honourable house, to elect a senator of the United States on Wednesday next. We have fixed on this early day, because at this time the members of both houses of the legislature, with a very few exceptions, are at the seat of government.
