The bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Stephen Lewis and Betsy Lewis, of Worcester county, was read the second time.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Queen-Anne's county to levy a sum of money on the assessable property of said county for the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following resolutions: A resolution in favour of Reuben Moore; in favour of Philemon Griffith, and in favour of William Wall; which were severally read and referred to the committee on revolutionary soldier's petitions. And a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Richard M. I. Anson of the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Jemima Rockhold of Harford county, and for other purposes; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Lydia True and Eleanor Long, of Saint Mary's county; the bill, entitled, An act to prevent the erection of booths within two miles of any camp or quarterly meeting in Baltimore county; the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to public roads in Worcester county, passed in December session eighteen hundred and seventeen, were read the second and third time by special order, severally passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk. The bill, entitled, An act for the revaluation of real and personal property in the counties therein mentioned, was read the second time by special order. The bill, entitled, An act respecting subscriptions for stock in turnpike roads, chartered by the legislature of this state; the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Robert Atwell of Anne-Arundel county; the bill, entitled, An act for the erection of a new market house in Hagers Town Washington county, and for other purposes; the bill, entitled, An act to increase the per diem of jurors in Baltimore county; were severally read the second and third time by special order and will pass.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Richard M. I. Anson of the city of Baltimore, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and postponed for further consideration.
