THURSDAY, January 7, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. Mr. Gale, Mr. Emerson and Mr. Winchester, appeared in the senate. The proceedings from Thursday the 24th December inclusive, were read. The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Jemima Rockhold of Harford county, and for other purposes; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Lydia True and Eleanor Long, of Saint Mary's county; the bill, entitled, An act to prevent the erection of booths within two miles of any camp or quarterly meeting in Baltimore county; the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to public roads in Worcester county, passed in December session eighteen hundred and seventeen; the bill, entitled, An act respecting subscriptions for stock in turnpike roads chartered by the legislature of this state; the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Robert Atwell, of Anne Arundel county; the bill, entitled, An act for the erection of a new market house in Hagerstown, Washington county, and for other purposes; and the bill, entitled, An act to increase the per diem of jurors in Baltimore county; were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following message:

And the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Jesse Wright of Caroline county; a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named; a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for making a turnpike road from the public square in Hagerstown, to the town ofoonsborough, in Washington county; a bill, entitled, An act for the preservation of the navigation of a branch of Nanticoke river called North West Fork, in Dorchester county; a bill, entitled, An act to appoint Gustavus W. T. Wright trustee, to sell and dispose of the lands therein mentioned; a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of Francis Adams, of John, of Charles county; and a bill, entitled, An act for the support of Elizabeth Mason, of Saint Mary's county; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk:

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the improvement of McClure's dock in the city of Baltimore, was read the second, and by special order the third time, when Mr. Gale moved to strike out the words "from time to time as they shall consider it necessary," in the 4th line of the enacting clause, and insert at the end, the following sections.

"And be it enacted, That whenever any of the commissioners heretofore appointed, or hereafter to be appointed, shall cease to be owners of property adjoining to said dock, their power and authority shall cease, and other persons shall and may be appointed in their place. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners shall have power and authority, from time to time, as often as they shall deem necessary, to cleanse and deepen said dock, and the expense of cleansing and deepening the same shall be levied and collected in the manner required by the original act to which this is a supplement, and the same proceedings shall be had therein."

On the motion to strike out as proposed, it was determined in the negative.

Mr. Gale then withdrew his other amendments, and the bill passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed: 1. After the word "that" in the first line of the 1st section strike out to the word "in" in the 9th line of same section, and insert the words "the commissioners for Calvert county appointed by the act to which this is a supplement, shall not." 2. In the 10th line same section strike out the words "they shall not."

The bill, entitled, An act to quiet possessions and prevent suits at law, was read the second time.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a resolution relative to pay during the recess; which was read. And the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the west bank of the Conotocheague creek at Williamsport, to intersect the Cumberland turnpike road at or near Stone Quarry Ridge; a bill, entitled, An act to confirm and make valid a deed from Charles G. Dorsey to William Shipley, junior; a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company to be styled The Bank of Westminster; a bill, entitled, An act to repeal the fourth section of an additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insol-
