MONDAY, January 18, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. Jackson and Mr. Winder appeared in the senate.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Juliana Cunningham, of Frederick county; the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of William Greeson, of Frederick county, were severally read the second time; the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for founding an Academy in Hagerstown, Washington county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed At the end of the bill add the following, "herein authorised, or which the trustees had authority to do by the act to which this is a supplement."

The bill, entitled, An act to amend the law in the cases therein mentioned; the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Ann Stern, of Anne-Arundel county; the bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to ascertain the allowance to jurymen and witnesses of the general court, and the several county and orphans courts in this state, were read the second time.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Charles Yeger and Caroline Yeger, of Frederick county; the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties; the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Eleanor Wood, Elizabeth Robertson and Margaret Scott, of Saint Mary's county, were severally read the second time.

On motion, The senate resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for building a bridge over Choptank river, at or near Denton ferry, which on reconsideration was passed. The bill, entitled, An act to confirm and make valid a deed from Charles G. Dorsey to William Shipley junior, was read the third time and will pass.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to authorise Ruth Tolson to complete the collections of John Tolson, her deceased husband, late collector of Queen-Anne's county. Ordered, That Messrs. Carmichael, Hollyday and Gale, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, was read the third time and will pass.

The clerk of the house of delegate delivers a resolution in favour of Samuel Griffith; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on revolutionary pensioners. And the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act relating to schools, and for the distribution of a certain fund, in Queen-Anne's county; a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Saint Mary's county to borrow money for the erecting of a gaol in Leonard-town; a bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower Benjamin Lawrence, and Susan Ann his wife, to sell and convey the property therein mentioned; a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Matthew Cannon and Henrietta Cannon, of Somerset county; a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Somerset county; a bill, entitled, An act authorising Sarah Bowen, administratrix de bonis non of Benjamin Y. Bowen, to complete the collections of the said Benjamin Y. Bowen; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And a bill, entitled, An act to enable Peter Guillet, senior, of Somerset county, to purchase and hold real property within this state; which was read the first, and by special order the second and third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment.
