

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of John Read Magruder, late clerk, and Edward Harwood clerk of Prince George's county, was read the second; and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act to incorporate Saint Mary's Orphaline Female School, in the city of Baltimore; a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of William Palmer, senior, and others, of Prince-George's county; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the eldest daughter of Eleanor Nichols of Montgomery county; and a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Esther Irvin of Montgomery county; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Benjamin Pearce, of Cecil county; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of William Greenon of Frederick county, was read the third time and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed: Add to the end of the bill, Provided, that nothing herein contained shall affect the right of any person to the said land acquired or prosecuted before the passage of this act.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

## TUESDAY, January 26, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Magruder. The proceedings of yesterday were read Mr. Maxcy appeared in the senate.

Mr. Carmichael presented the petition of sundry citizens of Kent county; which was read, and referred to Messrs. Carmichael, Gale and Hughlett, to consider and report thereon.

The bill, entitled, An act to repeal the act, entitled, An act for the encouragement of such persons as will undertake to build water mills, was read the second time.

Mr. Carmichael from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Peregrine Wilmer which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Winchester, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to enlarge the powers of the levy court of Baltimore county Ordered, That Messrs. Winchester, Winder and Carmichael, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Winchester from the committee reported said bill; which was read the first, second and third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act for the relief of the poor of Kent county, was read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael, the following rule was read and adopted.

The president of the senate may call any member of the senate to take the chair to relieve him, when fatigued, in the discharge of his duties.

On motion of Mr. West, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to regulate the sale of transferred tobacco. Ordered, That Messrs. West, Emerson and Maxcy, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill, entitled, An act for the further compensation of jurors in Harford county, was read the third time by special order, and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the words "upon any one day," in the 10th and 11th lines of the enacting clause.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Rachel Weems of Anne-Arundel county; the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the town of Belle-Air in Harford county, were read the second time.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to confirm the title of Hugh Quigly and John M. Greagor, of Harford county, to certain lands therein mentioned, was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Taney presented the memorial of the trustees of the Liberty-town Academy in Frederick county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Taney, Emerson and Jackson, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Carmichael from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the breadth of a certain road in Kent county; which was read the first, and by special order the second and third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, the committee on engrossed bills was enlarged by adding the names of Mr. Cresap and Mr. Parnham.

On motion, Mr. Cresap was discharged from said committee and Mr. West appointed in his place.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to the city court of Baltimore, was read the third time, when Mr. Carmichael moved to strike out the first section. And the question being put, Will the senate agree to strike out the first section? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

A bill, entitled, An act relating to the copies of certain papers from the land office; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Maria Hinton of Anne-Arundel county; a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an old road in Cecil county; a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the North Branch Toll Bridge Company of Virginia to build a bridge over the north branch of Potomac; a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Theophilus Russell, and Ann his wife, of Kent county; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
