The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, February 3, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Hughlett appeared in the senate.

The bill, entitled, A further additional supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, was read the third time and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out from the word "lie" at the end of the 7th line of the enacting clause to the end of the bill, and insert "within the time now required by law."

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Joseph Darden of Talbot county, was read the third time by special order, and the question being put, Shall the bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

So it was determined in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Mary Louisa Hall of the city of Baltimore. Ordered, That Messrs. Carmichael, Maxcy and Parnham, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion of Mr. Gale, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relating to appeals from judgments of the justices of the peace in the several counties of this state to the respective county courts. Ordered, That Messrs. Gale, West and Emerson, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Richard Lawrence of the city of Baltimore, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act to incorporate Westminster, in Frederick county; a bill, entitled, An act to prevent swine from going at large in the town of Salisbury; and a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Francis Saunders and John Lynch, guardian of the children of George Saunders, late of Baltimore county; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the eldest daughter of Elenor Nicholls of Montgomery county and the bill, entitled, An act authorising John Stevens the elder, and Nicholas Martin, administrators of James Clayland, deceased, late sheriff of Talbot county, to complete the collections of said Clayland were severally read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to regulate the measurement of oats in the several counties therein mentioned was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. In the title of the bill strike out the words, "in the several counties therein mentioned" 2. In the 2d line 1st section strike out from the word "sold" to the word "shall" in the 5th line same section, and insert "in this state."

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of John Frey and Thomas Cole, of Cecil county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendments, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the words "and Thomas Cole," in the title of of the bill. Strike out the words "and Thomas Cole," 2d line of the bill. Strike out the word "their," last line of the bill and insert "his".

Mr. Gale from the committee reported a bill, entitled, An act declaring the continuation and extension of the charter of the Elkton Bank of Maryland; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to compel the sheriff of Harford county to keep a gaoler resident in the gaol of said county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the word "condition," 11th line of the bill and insert "condition."

The bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Matthew Wilson and Hannah Wilson, of Baltimore county, was read the second time and postponed for further consideration.

The bill, entitled, An act for the revaluation of real and personal property in the counties therein mentioned was read the third time and will pass with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. In the 3d section in the 3d line after the name "Samuel Lecompte" strike out the names "Thomas J. H. Eccleston and Levin Lake," and insert "Thomas J. Patterson and John Donovan."

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to Belle-Air, in Harford county, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to extend the powers of the several county courts of this state in relation to changing the venue in civil cases, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and postponed for further consideration.

The bill, entitled, An act for the preservation of the navigation of a branch of Nanticoke river called North West Fork, in Dorchester county, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
