

An act to incorporate the Phoenix Fire Insurance Company of Maryland, reported the same with sundry amendments.

The bill was read a second time, and on motion of Mr. Gale, the question was put, Will the senate receive the following as amendments to said bill? Amendments proposed. 1st. Alter the word thereafter 5th line 1st section insert "unless the same shall before that time be repealed by law, provided that no such repeal shall go to affect any policy that may be made, or any contract already in existence at the time of said repeal." 2d. After the word "institution" last line 2d section insert "not exceeding twenty cents per annum in each hundred dollars of their actual capital." Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill was then read a third time by special order, as amended, and the question put, Shall the said bill as amended pass? Determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Gale from the committee to whom was referred the bill further to continue an act passed at November session one thousand seven hundred and nine-five, entitled, An act to incorporate the Maryland Insurance Company, reported the same with sundry amendments.

The bill was read a second time, and on motion of Mr. Gale, the question was put, Will the senate receive the following as amendments to said bill? Amendments proposed. 1st. Strike out the word "forty" 1st line 2d page and insert the words "thirty-eight." 2d. After the word "thereafter" 2d line same page insert "unless the same shall before that time be repealed by law, provided that no such repeal shall go to affect any policy that may be made, or any contract already in existence at the time of said repeal." 3d. After the word "institution" 4th line same page insert "not exceeding twenty cents per annum in each hundred dollars of their actual capital." Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill was then read a third time by special order, as amended, and the question put, Shall the said bill as amended pass? Determined in the affirmative.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

Henderson his wife, formerly Mary H. Gilpin, guardian to the infant children of John Gilpin, late of Cecil county, deceased, to convey the lands therein mentioned; the bill to incorporate the Octorara Navigation Company; the bill to authorise John D. Henley of Harford county, to import and bring into this state certain negroes therein mentioned; and the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments, were sent to the house of delegates.

The bill for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned, was sent to the house of delegates with the following message:
