The bill for the revaluation of real and personal property in Montgomery county, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The bill to alter the time of holding the county court in Dorchester county, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The bill to make public certain streets in the city of Annapolis, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the preservation of the breed of fish, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The bill authorising Henry E. Coalman to remove certain negroes from the state of Louisiana into this state, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The bill to repeal all that part of the constitution and form of government as relates to the division of Washington county into five separate election districts, and for other purposes, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The bill to authorise the levy court of Harford county to levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The bill relating to consables and supervisors bonds in Harford county, and for other purposes, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The bill to prevent bullet playing in Union Town, in Frederick county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment. Amendment proposed. After the word "playing" 4th line enacting clause insert the word "shall." Sent to the house of delegates.
