

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill to alter and change the time of holding the levy court in Dorchester county; which was read and will pass

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill to repeal the act, entitled, An act authorising certain alterations in Baltimore county and city court rooms; which was read and will not pass.

The supplement to the act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, was read the second and third time by special order and will pass with the proposed amendment:

Amendment proposed Strike out the words "and to receive from the former commissioners a moiety of the money by them received and not expended" 5th 6th lines 2nd sec.

On motion of Mr. Cresap, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relative to habitual drunkards. Ordered, That Messrs. Cresap, Harper and Magruder, bring in the same.

The bill for the relief of Alexander Prentice, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second and third time by special order and will pass.

The supplement to an act passed at December session 1819, relating to the school fund in the several counties therein mentioned, was read the second and third time by special order and will pass

The senate resumed the consideration of the supplement to an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and sixteen, for the benefit of the securities of Thomas Thompson, collector of Dorchester county, deceased, which was read and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out 2nd sec.

The further supplement to the act, for the erection of a new market house in Hager's Town, Washington county, was read the second and third time by special order and postponed for further consideration

On motion of Mr. Carroll, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relating to foreigners brought into this state Ordered, That Messrs. Carroll, Harper and Maxcy, bring in the same.

The bill to alter the name of Thomas Bond of the city of Baltimore, was read the second and third time by special order and will pass.

The bill for the relief of Thomas Porter, of John, of Allegany county, was read the second time and laid on the table. On motion of Mr. Harper, the said bill was referred to Messrs. Harper, Carroll and Magruder.

The bill for the relief of Benjamin Parker, of Allegany county, was read the second time and laid on the table On motion, the said bill was referred to Messrs. Harper, Cresap and Carroll.

The bill for the benefit of the sheriff of Allegany county, was read the second time and laid on the table On motion, the said bill was referred to Messrs. Harper, Cresap and Carroll.

The bill for the benefit of William Harris of Allegany county, was read the second time and laid on the table. On motion the said bill was referred to Messrs. Harper, Cresap and Carroll.

The bill to alter the name of Thomas Bond of the city of Baltimore; the supplement to an act passed at December session 1819, relating to the school fund in the several counties therein mentioned; the bill for the relief of Alexander Prentice of the city of Baltimore; the bill to repeal the act, entitled, An act authorising certain alterations in Baltimore county and city court rooms; the bill to alter and change the time of holding the levy court in Dorchester county, the bill to repeal the act, entitled, An act to alter the time of holding the county court in Charles county, passed at December session eighteen hundred and nineteen; the bill ceding to the United States the jurisdiction of the state of Maryland in to and over certain lands on North Point and Bodkin Island, at the mouth of the river Patapsco, and for other purposes; the supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the police of the city of Baltimore; the bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned; the bill to enlarge the powers of the levy court for Baltimore county in the cases therein mentioned; the supplement to an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and sixteen, for the benefit of the securities of Thomas Thompson, collector of Dorchester county, deceased, and the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, were sent to the house of delegates.

The bill extending the time of taking the sheriffs bond of Cecil county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the words "first day of April" 4th line enacting clause, and insert "twenty fifth day of February." Sent to house of delegates.

The bill for the benefit of the Baltimore General Dispensary was read the second time and laid on the table

The bill authorising Robert W. Kent of Anne Arundel county, to remove certain negroes into the state of Maryland, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and postponed for further consideration

On motion of Mr. Carmichael, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to repeal all such parts of the several acts of assembly as prohibit the importation of slaves into this state. Ordered, That Messrs. Carmichael, Maxcy and Magruder, bring in the same.

Mr. Harper reports a bill, entitled, An act for the better regulation of chancery proceedings in certain cases; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table

The bill authorising George A. Dunkel, of the city of Baltimore, to remove a certain negro slave from Berkley county, Virginia, into this state, was read the third time and will not pass.

Mr. Harper reports a bill, entitled, An act to alter such parts of the constitution and form of govern-
