The bill relating to foreigners brought into this state, was read the third time and will not pass.

Mr. Taney from the committee reports a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the support and maintenance of debtors actually confined in prison; which was read the first time and laid on the table.

The bill for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Calvert county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment. Amendment proposed. Strike out 2nd section. Sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cresap presented the petition of the directors of the Bank of Cumberland; which was read and referred to Messrs. Cresap, Harper and Carroll, to report thereon.

Mr. Harper from the committee reports a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the Baltimore Exchange Company; which was read the first time and laid on the table.

The bill for the relief of the managers of the Medical College Lottery, was read the second time by special order and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Carnichael, the said bill was made the order of the day for Saturday 13th inst.

The bill to incorporate a Lutheran church in Reisters-town, Baltimore county, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The bill for the better regulation of chancery proceedings in certain cases, was read the third time and will pass.

The bill to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the council, and to the appointment of certain officers, was read the second time and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Harper, the said bill was made the order of the day for Monday 15th inst.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to establish a bank in the city of Baltimore, and to an act, entitled, A supplement to an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes; a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the repair of the court house in Prince George's county; a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the building a court house in Anne Arundel county; a bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Prince George's county to levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned; a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Catharine M. Keirnan of Washington county; a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act passed at December session on the 27th day of December in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and eleven, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery or lotteries in the city of Baltimore, and a bill, entitled, An act to repeal all that part of the constitution and form of government as relates to the division of Washington county into five separate election districts, and for other purposes, passed the last session; which were read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
