

The bill to authorise Mary Young of the city of Baltimore, to import and bring into this state from the state of Virginia a certain negro slave, was read the third time and will pass.

The bill for the relief of Charlotte Warfield, of Montgomery county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass.

The bill relating to the crier of Baltimore county court, was read the second time and laid on the table.

The senate adjourns until 4 o'clock, P.M.

POST MERIDIE M, 4 o'clock.

The senate met.

On motion of Mr. Harper, William Carmichael, esq. was appointed president pro tempore in the place of William Spencer, esq. president, who was indisposed.

His excellency the governor attending, Ordered, That Messrs. Harper and Taney wait upon the house of delegates, and inform them that his excellency is attending in the senate chamber for the purpose of signing and sealing such of the engrossed bills, as have been assented to and request their attendance.

The speaker attended by the members of the house of delegates, appeared in the senate, and the engrossed bills from No. 1 to 126, inclusive, were presented by the speaker to his excellency the governor who signed and sealed the same in the presence of both houses.

The senate adjourns until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

TUESDAY, February 13, 1821.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution relative to furnishing the government house; the bill for the relief of Charlotte Warfield of Montgomery county; the bill to authorise Mary Young, of the city of Baltimore, to import and bring into this state from the state of Virginia, a certain negro slave; the bill for the benefit of Elizabeth Dickins of the city of Baltimore; the bill to incorporate the Medical Society of Baltimore; the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to authorise a lottery or lotteries in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and eleven, chapter eighty seven; the bill for the relief of Hector Perkins and James McCann, of the city of Baltimore; the bill for the relief of Anthony Yerkess; the bill for the benefit of Joseph Jamison and Frederick Johnston, of Baltimore county; the bill for the benefit of Henry W. Fitzhugh, now of the city of Baltimore; the bill for the relief of Littleton Dennis Peackle, of Somerset county; the bill to incorporate a Lutheran church in Reister's-town, Baltimore county; the bill to declare void certain deeds therein mentioned, and to confirm others; and the bill for the relief of the Library Company of Baltimore, were sent to the house of delegates.

The bill for the benefit of All Hallows Parish in Anne-Arundel county, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass.

The bill relating to bail in civil cases, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass.

The bill relating to the crier of Baltimore county court, was read the third time by special order and will pass.

The bill to confirm and make valid an ordinance of the corporation of the city of Baltimore, and the bill to alter and change the name of George Charles Townes, to that of George Charles Thompson, were read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass.

The bill to authorise James Stevens, and Mary Ann alias Anna Maria, his wife, to lease the lot or parcel of ground therein mentioned, was read the third time and will pass.

The bill for the relief of Lewis Helms of the city of Baltimore, was read the second, and third time by special order, and will pass with the proposed amendment. Amendment proposed. At the end of the bill add, "but did so come for the purpose of bona fide fixing his residence in this state."

Mr. Harper from the committee reports the additional supplement to the act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, with sundry amendments; the bill was then read the third time and will pass with the proposed amendments: Amendments proposed, 1st. Strike out the 2d sec. 2nd. From the end of the third sec. strike out to the end of the bill, and insert "And be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall not be lawful for the fifth regiment, the regiments of artillery and cavalry, and battalions of riflemen, or any of them, to enrol volunteers beyond the limits of their respective brigades, according to the limits as now established, or the limits which may hereafter be established. And be it enacted, That this act shall continue and remain in force until the end of the next session of the general assembly."

The bill for the benefit of the Havre de Grace Bank, was read the third time and will pass.

The bill for the relief of Joseph Delaplane, of Montgomery county, was read the second time and laid on the table.

Mr. Gale from the committee reports the bill relating to causes removed for trial within the sixth, fifth, and third judicial districts, with sundry amendments; the bill was then considered and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. In 4th line 1st sec. strike out the words "third and fifth." 2. In same line same sec. strike out the letter "s" at the end of the word "districts." 3. In 8th line same sec. strike out from the word "trial" to the end of the sec. and insert "and which shall require the intervention of a jury, shall be tried, dismissed, continued, or otherwise disposed of for that time." 4. In 3d line 2d sec. strike out the letter "s" at the end of the word "districts." 5. In 8th line same sec. strike out the words "or determination" and insert "as aforesaid and." 6. Strike out in the title the words "third and fifth judicial districts" and insert "district"

The further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, was read the third time, and on motion referred to the consideration of the next general assembly.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a resolution relative to the penitentiary; a further supplement to the act, entitled, An act relating to insolvent debtors in the city and county of Baltimore; a bill entitled, An act to confirm the appointment of collector of the tax for Charles county, and for other purposes; and a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Cecil county to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; which were read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And reports the bill for the more effectual amendment of legal proceedings, endorsed "will not pass."
