On motion the following message was read, assented to and sent to the house of delegates:

THURSDAY, JANUARY 3, 1822

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr Bowie appeared in the senate.

The bill to authorise John Weems, of Anne Arundel county to bring into this state a certain negro slave therein mentioned, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill to authorise William Renoe, of Charles county, to remove a certain negro into this state, was read a third time and will not pass.

The bill for the revaluation of real and personal property in Calvert county, was read a third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment. Amendments proposed 1st. In the 3d line 2d section, strike out "Richard Robert" and insert "James B. B. warn." 2d. In the 4th line 2d section strike out "John Lawrence" and insert "Mordecai Smith."

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled *A further supplement to an act entitled, An act regulating the inspection of tobacco.* Ordered, That Messrs Bowie, Miller and Kent bring in the same.

The bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Talbot county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, was read a third time and will pass.

The bill for the revaluation of real and personal property in Calvert county; the bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Talbot county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, and the bill authorising William Renoe, of Charles county, to remove a certain negro into the state of Maryland, were sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a resolution in favor of Catharine Kilty; which was read the first and by special order the second time, and on motion, made the order of the day for to-morrow. Also the bill entitled, *A supplement to the act entitled, an act incorporating into one the several acts relating to constables' fees;* which was read, and on motion referred to Messrs Johnson, Orrell and Bowie. Also the bill entitled, *An act to incorporate the trustees of Saint James' academy or school in Baltimore county,* and the bill entitled, *A supplement to the act entitled, An act to change and alter the mode of repairing the public roads in Caroline county;* which were read the first time and laid on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Frederick county into election districts; which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr Bowie from the committee reports a bill entitled, *A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco;* which was read the first time and laid on the table.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 4, 1822.

The bill for the benefit of Captain James Allen, of Cecil county, was read a third time, and on motion laid on the table.

Mr Johnson from the committee reports a bill to regulate the removal of civil and criminal cases from one county to another; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution in favor of Catharine Kilty being the order of the day for today, was taken up, read a third time, assented to and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr Brownley presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying that a law may pass authorising the levy court of Harford county to open and make a good county road in said county; which was read and referred to Messrs Brownley, Miller and Price.
