TUESDAY, JANUARY 8, 1822.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the benefit of the trustees of the Catholic Cathedral church of Baltimore, was read the first time and laid on the table.

The resolution in favor of William Jacobs was read a third time and assented to.

The bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act regulating the inspection of tobacco, was read a second time, and the further consideration of the same postponed until to-morrow.

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill regulating the removal of civil and criminal cases from one county to another, which was read a third time, and the question being put, Shall the bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

AFFIRMATIVE.—Messrs Claude, Johnson, McKim, Orrell, Price and Quinton.—6.

NEGATIVE.—Messrs. President, Bowie, Brownley, Dickinson, Kent, Muller.—6. Determined in the negative.

On motion, the election of a director of the bank of Baltimore, on the part of the state, was postponed until to-morrow.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill to make valid a deed therein mentioned; a bill for the relief of the infant children of Levin H. Campbell, late of Dorchester county; which were read the first time and laid on the table; and returns the bill providing for the appointment of an attorney general, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments," which amendments were read, and on motion ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution in favor of William Jacobs, and the resolution in favor of Thomas Post, were sent to the house of delegates.

Wheeler of Talbot county; a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company to be styled the bank of Westminster; a bill relative to the making of a public landing place and road in Somerset county, which were read the first time and laid on the table; and returns the bill to provide for the inspection of ground black oak bark, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read the first, and by special order the 2d and 3d time, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill to repeal an act entitled, An act for the relief of poor and distressed families in cases of execution for debt and distress for rent, was read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr. Johnson from the committee to whom was referred the bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act incorporating into one, the several acts relating to constables fees, reports the same with sundry amendments. Which amendments were read, assented to and the bill ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Johnson presents the petition of Samuel R. Smyth of Baltimore, praying for the erection of a new tobacco ware house in Baltimore; which was read and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Bowie and Quinton.

WEDNESDAY JANUARY 9, 1822.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. Mr. Cockey appeared in the senate. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill authorising commissioners to make alterations in the election districts of Montgomery county, and the bill for the relief of Thomas Henry and his wife of Montgomery county, were postponed until Monday next.

The bill to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Baltimore county into seven separate election districts, and for other purposes, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled a supplement to the act entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to levy a sum of money for completing the bridge over the Great Falls of Gunpowder at Meredith's Ford in said county, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill for the relief of Mary Nevitt of Saint Mary's county, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill to alter and repeal such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the division of Frederick county into election districts, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.
