The bill to incorporate the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Maryland, was read a second time by special order and referred to Messrs Price, Claude and Miller.

The bill to regulate the removal of certain civil cases from one county to another, was read a second time and laid on the table.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill concerning magistrates' judgments Ordered, That Messrs. Price, Bowie and Orrell bring in the same.

The bill for the benefit of the heirs and widow of John Vincent Cooksey was referred to Messrs. Bowie, Johnson and Dickinson

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following message:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Jan. 17, 1822.

Gentlemen of the Senate,—We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body to proceed this day at 12 o'clock to the election of a register of wills for Caroline county in the room of John Young, Esq. deceased. George A Smith, has been put in nomination by this house, and Messrs. Saulsbury and Jenifer are appointed on the part of this house to join such gentlemen as you may name to count the ballots.

Also a bill entitled, A supplement to an act to provide for a new assessment, and to appoint collectors of the county tax in and for the city and county of Baltimore; and a bill entitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate elections; which were read the first time and laid on the table

The bill for the relief of Leonard Smith, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The following message was sent to the house of delegates.

BY THE SENATE, Jan. 17, 1822.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,—We consent to your proposition to go into the election of a register of wills for Caroline county, this day at 12 o'clock. No additional nomination has been made by the senate. We have appointed Messrs. Bowie and Orrell to join the gentlemen named by you to count the ballots.

The bill for the relief of David Imbrie of the city of Baltimore, and the bill for the relief of Isaac Knight of Baltimore county were sent to the house of delegates.

The bill for the benefit of Lebanon Chapel in Talbot county, and the bill to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Boonsborough to Hager's-town and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore and for other purposes, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The senate proceeded to the election of a person to be recommended for the office of register of wills for Caroline county. The ballots being deposited in the ballot-box, the committee appointed by the senate to meet the committee appointed by the house of delegates, retired to the conference room, and after some time returned and reported that George A Smith had all the votes of the attending members. Whereupon it was declared in the senate that George A Smith, having had all the votes of the attending members, was unanimously elected to be recommended for the office of register of wills for Caroline county.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill relating to the university of Maryland, which was read the first and by special order a second time and referred to Messrs. Bowie, Price, Johnson, Dickinson, McKim, Brownley and Miller.

The bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act for the organization of the courts of common law in this state and for the administration of justice therein, was read a third time, passed with the proposed amendments and sent to the house of delegates. Amendments proposed 1st In the 2d line of the first section after the word "cases" insert the words "hereafter to be brought." 2d. In the third line 1st section, after the word "state" insert "where all the parties reside on that shore, and that fact appears in the proceedings"

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill entitled, A further supplement to an act regulating the inspection of tobacco, being the order of the day, and on motion the question was put Will the senate receive the following as an amendment? 2d line 1st section strike out the words "passage of this law" and insert "15th day of February next." Determined in the affirmative. On motion the question was put, Will the senate receive the following as an amendment? 4th line 1st section after the word and strike out "the said inspectors shall" and insert "to." Determined in the affirmative. On motion the question was put, Will the senate receive the following as an amendment? In the 6th line 1st section after the word "inspected" insert "whenever they shall be there requested by the owner or his agent." Determined in the affirmative. On motion the question was put, Will the senate receive the following as an amendment? In the 8th line 2d section strike out the word "paper" and insert "paste-board." Determined in the affirmative. On motion the question was put, Will the senate receive the following as an amendment? After the word "be" strike out the words "printed or" and insert "by the inspector."
