

Talbot county; a bill to incorporate the President and commissioners of the town of Elkton, and declare their powers, and a bill entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, An act for making certain Roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

The following message was read, agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates:

BY THE SENATE, January 23, 1822.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates*,—The bill for the benefit of the University of Maryland, which was agreed on by a committee of conference a few days since and received the sanction of your body, appears to the senate to be defective, in not providing a sufficient security for the payment of the interest by the professors of the institution. The nature of the bill putting it out of our power to amend it we would suggest, with a view to save time, the appointment of another committee of conference on this subject. Should you agree to the appointment of such a committee we would name on our part Messrs Johnson, Dickinson, M'Kim, Brownley, Miller, Claude, Chambers and Orrell.

Mr Wootton from the committee to whom was referred the bill for the benefit of Samuel Hobbitzel of Allegany county, reported the same without amendment, and on motion the further consideration of the bill was postponed until Monday next.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of Sarah Middleton; which was read and laid on the table. Also the following message:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Jan. 23, 1822.

The senate adjourned until tomorrow morning 10 o'clock.

THURSDAY, January 24, 1822.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr M'Kim presented the petition of the Stockholders of the Marine Bank of Baltimore, praying an act to authorise and empower the president and directors of said Bank to remove said Bank to any part of the City; which was read and referred to Messrs M'Kim, Dickinson and Kent.

The bill for the benefit of Mary Scott of Charles county, was read a second and by special order a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill to repeal part of the act of Assembly therein mentioned and for other purposes, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill relative to the Town of Elkton in Cecil county, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill annulling the marriage of the Theophilus Russel of Kent county, and Ann his wife, was read a second time and referred to Messrs Chambers, Quinton, Dickinson, Cockey and Wootton.

The bill to authorise Walker K. Armistead to remove a certain negro into the state of Maryland, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution rescinding a resolution of 1817; a bill for the relief of Eleanor Hicks, of Charles county; the bill for the support and maintenance of Teresa Mankin of Charles county, and her infant children, and a bill authorising the levy court of Frederick county to raise a sum of money to build a bridge over Big Pipe creek; which were severally read the first time and laid on the table.

The bill declaring the assent of the legislature to a conveyance of lands in Harford county, made in trust for the benefit of the Preachers of the Methodist Episcopal church that may have families on the Harford Circuit, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill entitled, A further supplement to the act for the valuation of real and personal property in Caroline county, was read by special order a second and third time and will pass with the proposed amendments. Amendments proposed, 1st. In the 6th line 1st section, after the word "to" insert the words, "appoint assessors to." 2nd. In the endorsement on the title page after the word entitled. Strike out the words "An act as." Sent to the house of delegates.

Mr Johnson from the committee presented the following report and message:

The committee appointed on the part of the senate to confer with the committee on the part of the house of delegates, on the bill relating to the University of Maryland, beg leave to report, that they have had the same under consideration and have agreed to adopt certain amendments.
