

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

The bill appointing commissioners for the regulation and improvement of the village of Hillsborough in Caroline county, was read a second time and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Miller the bill to incorporate the president and commissioners of the town of Elkton and declare their powers, was referred to Messrs. Chambers, Miller and M. Kim.

The bill to make valid a deed therein mentioned, was read a second time and referred to Messrs. Price, Orrell and Cockey.

The supplement to the act to establish a patrol in Saint Mary's Anne Arundel, Prince-George's and Charles counties, passed December session 1820, chap. 200, was read a second time and referred to Messrs. Claude, Wootton or Kent.

The bill to authorise the establishment of an additional ware-house in the city of Baltimore, for the inspection of tobacco, was read a second time and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Johnson, Leave given to bring in a bill to be entitled, An act relating to the city of Baltimore, and to certain officers therein mentioned. Ordered, That Messrs. Johnson, Wootton and M. Kim, be a committee to bring in the same.

The bill to appoint commissioners for the purpose of altering the divisional line between the first and fourth election districts in Allegany county, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill relating to crimes and punishments in the city of Baltimore, was read a second and by special order a third time, amended, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The supplement to an act to incorporate a company for the maintenance and education poor female children by the name of the Benevolent Society of Baltimore, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill for the benefit of Marcellus Keene of the city of Baltimore, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill entitled, A further supplement to the act to incorporate the stock-holders of the Union Bank of Maryland, was read a second time and referred to Messrs. M. Kim, Quinton and Kent.

The bill to continue in force the acts of assembly that would expire with the present session, was read a second time and referred to Messrs. Price, Claude and Miller.

The supplement to the act for founding a college on the western shore of this state and constituting the same, together with Washington college on the eastern shore into one university, by the name of the University of Maryland, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to voters, so far as they concern the city of Baltimore, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The supplement to the act for the preservation of the navigation of a branch of Nanticoke river, called North West Fork, in Caroline county, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill to authorise the abutment of a bridge on the Maryland shore of the Potomac river at Harper's Ferry and for other purposes, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The supplement to the act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the public square in Hager's town to intersect the turnpike road leading from Gettysburg through Nicholson's Gap at the Pennsylvania line, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The resolution relative to the sale of public stock was read a second time and referred to Messrs. M. Kim, Orrell and Quinton.

The resolution in favor of Richard W. West, was read a second time and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Miller and Price.

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill annulling the marriage of Theophilus Russel of Kent county, and Ann his wife, being the order of the day, and on motion it was postponed until tomorrow.

The resolution in favor of Luther Martin; the bill to repeal the act for the relief of poor and distressed families in cases of execution for debt & distress for rent; and the bill empowering the levy court of Harford county in their discretion to build two bridges over Deer Creek in Harford county, were sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to the Auditor's accounts; a resolution relative to the treasurer's accounts, and a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act for incorporating a society to educate and maintain poor orphans' and other destitute female children, by the name of the Orphaline Charity School of the city of Baltimore; which were read the first time and laid on the table.

The bill concerning the Shepherd's-Town bridge company, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The supplement to the act incorporating into one the several acts relating to constables' fees, was returned to the house of delegates with the following message:

BY THE SENATE, January 4, 1822.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates—In compliance with the request of your message of 1st inst. we have reconsidered the amendments heretofore adopted by us to the bill entitled, A supplement to the act incorporating into one the several acts of assembly relating to constables' fees, and have passed the same without that part of the third amendments which was rejected by you.
