6th. In the 5th line same section after the word "before" insert the words "the legislature

7th. In the same line same section after the word "branch" strike out the words "of the legislature" and insert the word "thereof."

8th. At the end of the 9th section strike out the words "of this state"

9th. In the 4th line 10th section after the word "qualified" insert the words "as is hereinafter provided for."

10th. In the 4th line 11th section strike out the word "accrued" and insert the word "occurred."

11th. Strike out the 13th section of the bill for the purpose of inserting the following: "And be it enacted.
