The speaker and members of the House of Delegates having retired, the senate adjourned

until menday morning 10 o'clock.

MONDAY, February 10, 1823.

The senate met. Present the same members as on daturday, except Mr. Erownley, Proceedings of Saturday were read. The clerk of the naise of delegates returned the bill for the relief of Robert Oniver, of

the city of Baltimore, with the following message:
BY TILE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, February 10, 1823, Gentlemen of the Senate,-We would respectfully request a reconsideration of the bill, en-

titled, An act for the rener of Robert Hiver.

It appears by the will of William Knight, whose property became eschented to the state on his death, that it was his intention, that what property soever he might die rossessed et, should go to the children of the said Robert Oliver. It has been stated to this house, that Wr. K. a. it, at the time of his death, owed to Mr. Oliver a debt greater in amount than the value of the ploperty which became escheated. In presenting this view of the case, we would express the hope. that all objections to the passage of the bill may be removed.

Also a bid, entitled, An act for the relief of Catharine Stimmel, wife of Damel B. Simmel, of Frederick county; which was read the first time and laid on the table. Also a bill, chilled, An act to revive and keep in force the act of assembly therein mentined, and the several supplements thereto, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and laid on the table.

The supplement to the act, entitled, An act to carry into execution a resolve of the congress of the United States, respecting the safe keeping of persons committed under the authorit, of the United States, to gaols of this state, was read a third time, passed, and sent to the house of

delegates.

The bill for the relief of the securities of Thomas Bailey, former collector of the tax for Baltimore county and city, was read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The 1e, ort of the committee appointed to examine into the state of the files and records of

the sen te, was read a second, and by special order a third time and concurred in.

On motion by Mr. Johnson, Ordered, that the chief clerk of the senate arrange all the files and records of the senate in the way he may think best calculated to preserve them, and to make a reference to them easy.

Mr. Johnson from the committee to whom was referred the supplement to the act for the relief of the Cumberland Bank of Allegany, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought not to pass. Which report was concurred The bill was then read a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill for the relief of Catharine Stammi, wife of Daniel B. Stimmil of Frederick county,

was read a second time by special order and laid on the table.

The resolution in favour of the collectors of the tax was read a third time, assented to, and sent to the House of Delegates.

The bill for the relief of Catharine F. Barriere, of the city of Baltimore, was read a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Quinton from the committee to whom was referred the bill relating to a landing place on the north west brunch of Nanticoke river' reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass with the following amendments,
