The bill to encourage the destruction of crows in the several counties therein mentioned, was read a second time, amended

so as to exclude Kent county, and laid on the table.

Mr. Quinton from the committee to whom was referred the supplement to the act, entitled "an additional supplement to the act entitled an act to regulate public ferries," reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion, that it ought to pass with the following amendment, wiz: at the end of the second section, add "said bond to be recorded in the county court of said county, and a copy thereof under the seal of said court, to be as good and competent evidence in any court in this state as the original would be, if produced and proved;" which amendment was read and assented to. The bill was then read a second and third time by special order, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to extinguishing the state debt. Also, a resolution relative to the powers of congress, which were read the first time

and laid on the table.

Also, a bill entitled "an act to regulate the meetings of the trustees of the poor of Dorchester county," Also, a bill entitled "an act to confirm the name of Walker Bennett Dickerson, alias Walker Bennett Schowdrink, of Dorchester county," which were read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, a bill entitled "an act to incorporate the La Fayette Beneficial Society of Baltimore," which was read the first time

and referred to Messrs. Miller, Johnson, and Kent.

Also, a bill entitled "an an act to confirm act entitled an act to alter and abolish so much of the constitution and form of government of the state of Maryland, as relates to the oath to be taken by the senators and delegates previous to the election of governor and council," which was read the first time and laid on the table.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Friday, January 13th, 1826.

The senate met. Present, the same members as on yester-

day. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution relative to the records of Talbot county court, was read a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates, delivered a bill entitled an act for the support and maintenance of James McCarty, of Caroline county," which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Miller, Orrell, and Dickinson.
