

## OF THE SENATE.

President of the Senate, who in the Senate Chamber, shall open and count the votes, in presence of the Senate and House of Representatives—and if the House of Representatives fail to attend, he shall proceed to count in the presence of the Senate only; when the person having the highest number of votes, shall be the President of the United States.

No member of Congress shall be eligible to any office within the gift or nomination of the President of the United States, during the period for which he shall have been elected, and for six months thereafter, except appointments in the regular Army or Navy of the United States.

Also, a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the mutual insurance company of Baltimore; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Scott, Johnson and Orrell.

Also, a bill entitled an act for the relief of Barbara Wagers, William Lowe, John Clary and Richard Howard, of Frederick county; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Scott, Orrell and Quinton.

Also, a bill entitled an act to appropriate a part of the school fund belonging to Frederick county, to the purposes therein mentioned and for other purposes; which was read the first time and laid on the table. And returns the bill for the relief of Catharine Jennison, of the city of Baltimore; endorsed, will pass.

The bill to repeal an act to increase the pay of the judges of the orphans court for Baltimore, Dorchester and Washington counties, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and eighteen, chapter forty five, so far as relates to Dorchester county; was read a third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.
