

The bill to repeal an act requiring the judges of the county courts of the fourth judicial district of this state, to set apart certain days for the transaction of chancery business in said courts, so far as the same relates to Caroline county, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The supplement to the act relating to the appointment of constables in this state, and for other purposes, passed at December session, 1824, chapter 140, was read a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Scott from the committee to whom was referred the bill for the re-valuation of real and personal property in Dorchester county, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass with the following amendment, viz,

In the 2nd, 6th and 7th lines, 3rd section, strike out "Isaac Williams and Thomas Hayward," and insert "John Miller and John Donovan." Which amendment was read and assented to; the bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message; which was read:

By the House of Delegates,

24th January, 1826.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

This being the day appointed for filling up the vacancy in the senate of the United States, occasioned by the resignation of the honorable Edward Lloyd, we propose, with your concurrence, to proceed to said election at 12 o'clock. Ezekiel F. Chambers has been nominated in this house, and we have appointed Messrs Boon and Duvall, to join such gentlemen as may be named by your body, to count the ballots and report the result.
