

Baltimore; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Miller, and Dickinson.

The engrossed bill relating to evidence in civil cases, was read a third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion the supplementary act, to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make the several turnpike roads therein mentioned, passed at December session, 1815, chapter 190, was re-committed.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act to relieve executors and administrators from the obligation of performing the duties of guardians, as is required by an act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty, chapter one hundred and seventy four; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Scott, Claude and Orrell.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

Friday, February 3d, 1826.

The senate met. Present, the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The clerk of the council delivered the following communication from the executive, which was read with the accompanying letters, and referred to the house of delegates.

The additional supplement to the act directing the manner of serving out attachments in this province, and limiting the extent of them, the same being the order of the day, was read a second time, amended, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
