

Add at the end of the message,

'We would beg leave respectfully to suggest to your honorable body, the expediency of your appointing in addition to the gentlemen already named in your message, a gentleman of the medical profession.

The necessity of the contemplated mission, in a great measure, grows out of the memorial now before your honorable body, praying for the establishment of a new medical college in the city of Baltimore. We therefore humbly presume, when the object of the mission is kept in view, and the duties which will devolve on the committee, are duly estimated, a joint committee, consisting of three gentlemen from your house, and two from the senate, will not be considered too numerous.'

Determined in the affirmative.

The message was then assented to as amended, and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Quinton from the committee to whom was referred, the bill to revise and extend the provisions of an act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Snow Hill, in Worcester county, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass, with the following amendment, viz---

"Strike out the whole of the first section." Which amendment was read and assented to. The bill was then read a second and third time by special order, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act to authorise the orphans courts of this state, to order the sale of real estate in certain cases, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Bowie, Johnson and Thomas.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to enable purchasers to obtain possession of lands and premises sold by sheriffs, coroners and elizors, at public auction; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Claude, Johnson and Brownley.

On motion the question was put, "will the senate re-consider the resolution for a stay of executions on judgments obtained by the state against George Dashiell, former sheriff and collector of Somerset county, and his securities, and also on judgments obtained against Charles Jones, late sheriff of said county, on account of his defaults for said Dashiell, and his securities, with the amendments thereto?" Determined in the affirmative. The same being read, the question was put, "will the senate adhere to the amendments heretofore made by the senate to the resolution?" Determined in the negative. The question was then put, "will the senate assent to the resolution?" Determined in the negative; and it was returned to the house of delegates.
