

Mr. Johnson offered the following resolution, which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate, February 3d, 1826.

*Resolved*, That further proceedings on two judgments obtained by the state of Maryland, in Somerset county court, against George Dashiell, former sheriff and collector of said county, and Benjamin Dashiell, James Dashiell, William Stewart, and John Jones, his securities; and on certain other judgments rendered by default in said county court, against Charles Jones, also late sheriff of said county, on writs of *capias ad satisfaciendum*, issued on the two first judgments aforesaid, and placed in the hands of said Jones, as sheriff aforesaid, be, and the same are hereby suspended until the 1st day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven.

*Resolved*, That all the interest beyond six per cent. which has accrued or may accrue on the said judgments, be, and the same is hereby relinquished: *Provided*, The claim of the state on the judgments, with six per cent. interest thereon, be paid on or before the said 1st day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven.

*Resolved*, That unless the said claim of the state, on the aforesaid judgments, with six per cent. interest thereon, be paid on or before the said 1st day of January, 1827, it shall, and may be lawful for the said state to proceed upon said judgments in the same manner as she might have done at the periods at which they were severally rendered.

*Resolved*, That nothing herein contained, shall be construed to prevent the state from proceeding on any judgment or judgments she may have obtained in said court against John Fowler and Beachamp Ackworth, securities of the said George Dashiell, former sheriff, as aforesaid.

Mr. Johnson offered the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate, February 7, 1826.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate have reconsidered their amendments to the resolution granting a stay of executions on judgments obtained by the state against George Dashiell, former sheriff and collector of Somerset county, and his securities, and have receded therefrom. They have also rejected the original resolution, and have adopted a substitute, extending the required relief to said Dashiell; and all of his securities, but two. Their reason for excepting them, is, that they understand their conduct has not been such as entitles them to the indulgence of the state.
