

The resolution in favor of Charles Jones, was read a second time and laid on the table.

Mr. Kent appeared in the senate.

The resolution to confirm the acts of certain commissioners appointed by Somerset county court, was read a second, and by special order, a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution relative to repairs to the state-house, was read a second, and by special order, a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The supplement to an act to incorporate the trustees of Church Hill Academy, in Queen Anne's county, was read a second, and by special order, a third time, amended, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the house of delegates. Amendment proposed.—At the end of the bill, insert 'Provided, That this act shall not go into effect, unless accepted and approved of by the board of trustees of said academy, as at present constituted.'

Mr. Thomas made a favorable report upon the resolution in favor of P. B. Hopper. The resolution was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Quinton from the committee to whom was referred the bill to repeal in part a supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to sheriffs' and for other purposes; passed January the 27th 1816, chapter 129, so far as the same may be binding on the sheriff of Dorchester county, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought not to pass. The bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following messages, which were read.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose with your concurrence, to proceed this day at twelve o'clock, to the election of a register of wills, for Calvert county. Messrs. Jeremiah M. Baden, George Wilkinson and Samuel S. Hodgkin, are put in nomination by us, and Messrs. Dalrymple and Stevens, are appointed on the part of this house, to join such gentlemen as may be named by your honorable body, to examine the ballots and report thereon.
