Also, a bill entitled an act to authorise the excavation of a canal in Dorchester county, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, a bill entitled a supplement to an act entitled, an act to lay out and make a public road in Frederick county, passed at November session 1805, chapter 52, which was read a first time, and laid on the table.

And returned the resolutions relative to the state's claim against the United States, endorsed 'reconsidered, the first second and third resolutions adopted, and the fourth rejected,' which were laid on the table.

Mr. Brownley, from the committee to whom was referred, the resolution in favor of Samuel Bradford, late sheriff of Harford county, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass.—The resolution was then read a second time, and laid on the table.
