

Mr. Kent offered the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate, February 10th, 1826.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate having received your message of to day, proposing to go into the election of a register of wills for Calvert county, to day at twelve o'clock, and concur therein. The senate have put no person in nomination in addition to those named by you. The senate have appointed Messrs Kent and Quinton, to join the gentlemen named by you, to count the ballots, and report the result. By order,

The supplement to an act to provide for the prompt settlement and final close of the concerns of the Bank of Caroline, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twentyfour, chapter one hundred and sixty three, was read the third time, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates, delivered a bill entitled, an act to authorise the leasing and sale by Clarissa Philpot, and Edward P. Philpot, two of the minor children of Bryan Philpot, late of Baltimore county deceased, of certain lots of ground in the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Miller and Brownley

The bill to authorise the levy court of Frederick county, to appoint commissioners for the purposes therein mentioned, was read a second and third time, by special order, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to relieve executors and administrators from the obligation of performing the duties of guardians, as is required by an act passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty, chapter one hundred and seventy four, was read the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The senate proceeded to the election of a register of wills for Calvert county. The ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, sealed up, and delivered to the committee of the senate, appointed to meet the committee of the house of delegates, to count the ballots, who retired to the conference room.

The clerk of the house of delegates, delivered a resolution relative to the death of Sutton I. Weems, esq. which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kent, Thomas and Orrell.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Pennsylvania, Delaware and Maryland steam navigation company; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Brownley, Scott and Miller.
