And returned the resolution relative to a stay of execution on certain judgments obtained by the state, against George Dashiell, former sheriff and collector of Somerset county, and his securities; endorsed "assented to."

Mr Johnson from the committee to whom was referred, the bill to authorise the leasing and sale by Clarissa Philpot and Edward P. Philpot, two of the minor children of Bryan Philpot, late of Baltimore county deceased, of certain lots of ground in the city of Baltimore, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass. The bill was then read a second and third time, by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to light boats; which was read and referred to Messrs. Thomas, Kent and Quinton.

Also, a bill entitled, an act regulating appeals from magistrates courts; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Miller, Orrell and Kent.

The resolution in favor of Samuel Bradford, late sheriff of Harford county, was read a third time, by special order, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The committee appointed to count the ballots in the election for a register of wills for Calvert county, reported that Jeremiah M. Baden, had sixty seven votes, and George Wilkinson, had five votes.

Whereupon it was declared in the senate, that Jeremiah M. Baden, having had the greatest number of votes, was duly elected, to be recommended to the governor and council, to be commissioned register of wills for Calvert county.

Mr. Kent, from the committee to whom was referred the resolution relative to the death of Sutton I. Weems, esq. reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass. The resolution was then read a second and third time, by special order, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Thomas from the committee to whom was referred, the resolution relative to light boats, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass. The resolution was then read a second and third time, by special order, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.
